- Don't add "th" (or "st" or "nd") to dates; January 1, not January 1st.
- Don't include year as it is stated on the front page of the Newsletter unless the event occurs in the following year.

For concert and dance listings, **musicians' names are set in bold**, (with instruments played following parenthetically). Commas come after parentheses. *Group, band or orchestra names are set in bold italics.* Tel.eph.one. numbers are separated by periods, not dashes or parentheses.

And finally, our deadline day is the 7th of the prior month, we appreciate your adherence to this date, but by all means don't hesitate to send something to us sooner.
